No Man is An Island

#### **There Are Those** Who.....

- Believe and act as if they do not need anyone.
- Are so private and choose isolation as a • way of doing life.
- Refuse any vulnerability for fear of hurt.
- Trust no one and live with constant suspicion of others.

Do you know someone that fits one or more of these characteristics? Do you? Us church folk can certainly act as if everything is fine, and we do not need anyone. In short, we do our church life like we are an island to ourselves. I certainly do not want to minimize the challenge of fully human 'down at church.<sup>7</sup> You know what I mean. Being human is risky with church people. Everyone has their own standard of what is righteous and unrighteous, healthy, and unhealthy, what should be and should not be a part of "church." Then, there is the idea that religion is a private matter, woven deeply into the fabric of the American life and shows up in conversations and behaviors at church as well.

English poet John Donne wrote "No Man is an Island" following a serious illness (1623). The primary themes are what it means to be human and the relationship between humanity and God. Before going any further consider the whole prose by Donne.

No man is an island,

Entire of itself;

Every man is a piece of the continent,

A part of the main. If a clod be washed away by the sea,

Europe is the less,

As well as if a promontory were:

As well as if a manor of thy friend's

Or of thine own were.

Any man's death diminishes me,

Because I am involved in mankind.

And therefore, never send to know for whom the bell tolls:

It tolls for thee. (continued next column)

#### No Man Is An Island—Continued

Nothing causes one to reflect on being human and relationship with God like serious illness. I know. After five months and ten days in a hospital I had plenty of time to reflect with gratitude to God, my family, and friends. In my weakness I was fully dependent on others.

Literary analysts show that Donne was addressing the individualism and spirit of isolationism. A reality that certainly applies to being American. The spirit of individualism shows up 'down at church' in subtle and not so subtle ways.

The habit of where we sit in the assembly and with whom we interact.

The pattern with whom we share hospitality.

The meeting of "my needs" vs acting for the sake of others.

The expectation of church as an event only, rather than a relational community.

What would you add?

Following Jesus will always take us out of our comfort and convenient religious life.

#### Our Fall Sunday Morning & Wednesday Night Adult Bible Classes

#### The Gospel of Luke – Hughbert Collier – Auditorium

The children's Bible classes are focusing on the Gospel of Luke on Wednesday nights in preparation for the LTC in the spring. So, the adults are joining in the study of Luke in our Sunday morning adult class in the auditorium. The study of Luke reveals some unique and interesting characteristics. It is a universal Gospel message to peoples beyond the Jews. It gives greater meaning of the Gospel as good news by its emphasis on rejoicing. It is also the Gospel for the 'down and out.' There is more emphasis on the women of Jesus' ministry in this Gospel, and you will find more mention of angels. Luke, the physician writer, seems to give more details on the miracles of healing in his high-level literary style. And you will also find Luke is the Gospel of prayer, with more mention of the topic than the other gospels.

#### Young Adults Class – Discipleship 101 – Andy Brewer & Evan McLeroy in Room 109.

This class is available for college age and young adults without children. One does not need to study the New Testament very long to realize we are to be the disciples of Jesus who are making disciples of Jesus. We call this the great commission and is found in Mat. 28:18-20. But what does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus? That's the focus of this class.

The Fall Wednesday Night Adult Bible Classes will continue the Men's and Women's Classes and start a study of "Grow" in September with various teachers, which is also the topic the children are studying in their Sunday morning classes this fall. The Wednesday night Men's and Women's Bible Classes will discuss the Sunday morning sermon obstacle topic with the following questions:

What is the impact of this obstacle on our spiritual growth?

How do we avoid or reduce this obstacle to our spiritual growth?

How can we deal with this obstacle if we are currently experiencing it?

How can we help each other in our Christian family deal with the impact of this spiritual growth obstacle?

How can we turn this obstacle into an opportunity for spiritual growth?

In September the Wednesday Night Adult Men's and Women's Classes will discuss the Sunday Morning Sermon preached that week. The teachers will also have access to the sermon recordings and slides from the Sunday before. Also this material made use of Chuck Swindoll's book, <u>THREE STEPS FORWARD TWO STEPS BACK</u> (Persevering through Pressure) and class leaders may wish to consult the chapter corresponding to their lesson.
