HOML 5830 Biblical Preaching — Dr. Matthew Love Thursdays 1-3:45 p.m. (Begins January 15) A study of how Biblical preaching helps a contemporary congregation develop a solid Christian identity. Issues of interpretation are explored and paradigms for preaching from a variety of texts are given.

BMIN 5873 Leading Churches in Mission — Dr. Steve Cloer Mondays 1:00-3:45 p.m. (Begins January 12) A study of faithful ways to lead a church on mission. Discussions of missional leadership, gospel contextualization, neighborhood discernment, and local mission experiments.

BNEW 5261 Galatians and Romans - Dr. Jeff Peterson Thursdays 1-3:45 p.m. (Begins January 15) A study of two of Paul's influential letters, with special emphasis given to his aim in writing, the gospel articulated, and the ways these letters can inform contemporary Christian faith and practice.
