It is not simple to live moderation as a preacher because everyone has something they want the preacher to address. I don't say this in a cavalier way. There have been those sleepless nights knowing that my refusal to align with someone or a particular

position on issue would risk being labeled as "too conservative, liberal" or "spineless." Through the years, reasonableness has been a hard road to travel. Think of moderation in terms of reasonableness. "Let your reasonableness (moderation) be known to everyone; the Lord is at hand" (Phil 4.5, ESV). NRSV translates it as "gentleness." Either way, it is not an expression of extremism.

The middle ground, however, is sometimes labeled by those on the far left and far right as weak.

Taking a stand for what is right, true and healthy is clearly seen in the life of Jesus. Jesus did not mince words to those who turned religion into a set of rules that burdened people (Mt 23). He certainly called out hypocrisy (i.e., the cup that is clean on the outside but dirty on the inside). Yet, mercy, not sacrifice, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you and despitefully use you (Mt 5.44) does not sound like hunker down in your fox hole of extremism. If anything, being extreme in love as manifested as the fruit of the Spirit (Gal 5.23f) is radical—getting at the taproot of God's life. It's not a soft, failure to take a stand posture. To the contrary, it is a a willingness to focus on what really matters the kingdom of God, the gospel and truth as embodied in Jesus Christ applied to every area of life. It takes courage to avoid the extremes, to receive criticism, and to refusing to cater to any agenda of fear, name calling, and labeling.

Portraying everyone who disagrees as evil, the enemy or worse, someone to hate contaminates one's soul.

Finally, consider the descriptions of love in 1 Cor 13.4-7. Loving in this way is the greatest challenge in my life—marriage, ministry and with those whom I disagree. Keep in mind, Paul is addressing a divided, immature and polarized church. The problems impacting the church were rooted in the flesh, not the Spirit. They were carnal—"I could not address you as spiritual people, but as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ" 1 Cor 3.1).

#### **Article in the Christian Chronicle about Zimbabwe**

Harare—Prisons in the southern African nation overflow with souls hungry for the Gospel.

In the past year, two ministers for Churches of Christ reported nearly 900 baptisms through the New Life Behavior International curriculum.

Stanley Shereni and Eric Mangisi visit 19 prisons and teach nearly 9,000 prisoners and prison staffers each month, said Mike Biggers, president of New Life Behavior. The ministers work in partnership with the Graham Street Church of Christ in Stephenville, Texas.

A recent "Family Week" at the prisons allowed relatives and ministers to visit inmates who aren't otherwise allowed to have visitors. Shereni and Mangisi, along with Christians Donivert & Josephine Khata, counseled the inmates and provided supplies including toiletries and blankets.
